The burner top reduced cook time by 60% and the convection ovens were much more efficient and cooked the potatoes more evenly than our old model. A gentleman from the community was kind to donate his time to add a textured ceiling to cover imperfections and it looks great! (Thank you Eric.) They worked to get on a new coat of paint and new LED overhead lights will be installed once they arrive. Thank you to all who helped with this BIG (and HEAVY) project!

We served 190 at the meal this month. The applesauce we made in October for God's Work-Our Hands Day was a hit. Thank you also for the leftover cookies from the cookie walk to share with our families.

In Attendance:

The meeting was called to order by President David Bodi. The Mission Statement recited.

Minutes of Previous Meeting:

Minutes from the October 15th meeting reviewed. Jordan Kuns moved to accept the minutes. Motion seconded by Becky Henry. Motion passed.

Financial Report:

Written report provided by Jordan Kuns. General offerings for the month were \$13,038. Construction offerings were \$3,695. Additional giving totaled \$1,650. The operating surplus is now \$38,307. \$5,000 was applied towards the principle of the construction loan bringing the balance to \$35,000. \$2,000 in Noisy Offering donations were given in \$500 increments to Grace's Table, Margaretta Township Fire Department, Back To The Wild, and the Erie County Humane Society.

Becky Sessler moved to accept the financial report. Motion seconded by Joan Lander. Motion passed.

Minister's Report:

Minister Beth reports she did 6 hospital visits as wells 6 nursing home visits. Two of those visits included communion. She has attended two text studies with a group of ecumenical colleagues for text study and sermon preparation. She continues to attend Circles 3 & 5 meetings. She has started her monthly SAM check-in meetings and continues her Diakonia studies. She meets weekly with her SAM supervisor, Pastor Chris Young. Minister Beth also continues to meet with the Transition Team, plan worship, and oversee copyright reporting.

Per Larry, Hohler was here on 11/7 for their routine inspection. #3 boiler in need of repair. Parts are on order.
